Netted necklace with crosses



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Materials:

Seed beads in a main colour (here turquoise) and seed beads in a contrast colour (here yellow AB), one or two needles, thread and a closure – and patience ©

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First you make the chevron chain (turquoise thread path) in the length of your necklace. Then you have the choice of following first the red, then the blue thread path (or first blue, then red), or you could work with two threads and two needles and work one red part, one blue part, one red part ...

Working the blue part first means quite a bit of counting, working the red one first is easier – you can follow the crosses and contrast beads for adding the blue part. Working with two threads makes it easier to hold the tension, but you have the fun of fighting with two threads ©

The patience? It is not easy to coax the little crosses of the red thread path to be near those beads before the cross.
